INTERFAITH AND DENOMINATIONAL POLICY

We are God's instrument to help the poor and needy through highly qualified healthcare services. We do so by renewing the poor in spirit and sharing the good news.

Our Mission Statement defines clearly, who we are:

Jamaica Missions USA is the leader of global medical missions, defined by our exceptional healthcare services. Through our core drivers and a shared sense of fellowship, we integrate the resources of highly qualified medical professionals to fulfill the needs of the people we serve.

In order to bring clarity to this issue and avoid any confusion, Jamaica Missions USA has very clear procedures and policies related to a participant's acceptance on a project:

1. This organization holds to the premise that God has a plan of redemption for all of God's creation, and none of us are qualified to pass judgment on another. (John 12:32) (Matt 19:26) (Matt 7:1)
2. The well-being of our patients and volunteers are priority one on any project.
3. All religious traditions will be respected and we welcome people of other faiths and cultures to participate within the structure of our ministry projects.
4. The policy allows all of God's children to come together and get to know each other and work as one to serve the less fortunate of the world.
5. A person that is not a follower of Jesus is welcome to serve on any project.
6. All participants are representing Jamaica Missions USA and at no time is the participant allowed to share their faith in a way that would be outside of Jamaica Mission's mission of using Jesus as our Guide.
7. It is important that people from different cultures, denominations, etc. understand that how you follow your faith may differ greatly and that grace be shown at all times when a situation occurs that may make you uneasy.
8. All participants must be subservient to the direction of the Project and Medical Director. This is regardless of whether you agree or not. Jamaica Missions USA Directors have a tremendous amount of experience in these situations and what you think may be minor can be a major problem without your knowledge.
9. There is no greater experience in life than to help your fellow man using the gifts that God has provided.
